- **1.** Certain corrective measures were made for the improvement in academic standard as well as in internal evaluation process
- **2.** Effective efforts were made by all faculty members to improve the student's strength of the institute and for the same following activities have been conducted over the year.
- **INSPIRE Internship Camp** sponsored by DST, New Delhi was conducted for five days for Standard XI science students from schools of Anand, Vidyanagar, Nadiad, Borsad, Godhara, Ahemdabad and Baroda from 28th Nov to 2nd Dec'2016. Total 180 students participated in it.
- ARIBAS was selected as **BT-Capacity Building cell (PG-BT-CBC) by GSBTM, Gandhinagar.** To provide them guidance for the competitive exams, the cell has organized CSIR-NET Crash Course two times (22nd to 26th May '2015 and 1st to 5th December '2015 for students from all over Gujarat. Total 71 students participated in it.
- **Personal counseling in schools & in Colleges:** Total 810 school students and 120 college students were counseled and visited the institute.
- Training at ARIBAS: In total 100, B. Sc. Students attended different workshops and received hands on training on Bioinformatics Tools, Molecular biology and general analytical techniques used in the industry.

1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.

The restructuring of M. Sc. Integrated Biotechnology program is under consideration in the university. Presently, the course is of five and a half years with no lateral exit or entry after 6th semester (equivalent to graduation). The proposal is about reducing the duration of the course from five and a half years to five years and to allow for lateral exit and entry after 6th semester. The new program will be dual degree program. If the proposal gets through then syllabus revision will be done. For this a university level core committee has been constituted, Dr. Nilanjan Roy, Director ARIBAS is one of the committee members.

A new course on M. Sc. Forensic Science program (04 Semesters course, CBCS) has been approved by Sardar Patel University. The university syllabus is adopted as such.

Following innovative processes adopted by the institution to enhance academic performance:

- Seminar presentation is compulsory from good quality research paper downloaded from Pubmed Central; the presentation is delivered by the student in front of the whole class which has been evaluated by at least three faculty members.
- Evaluation of M.Sc. Dissertation thesis is made stream line. The evaluation of dissertation, undertaken by final semester students, is done in three stages i.e. Project proposal evaluation by examiners in open seminar, mid- term evaluation in the form of poster presentation and final thesis evaluation and presentation.
- Research methodology workshops are regularly conducted for the final year students.
- As per decentralization of external practical examination by Sardar Patel University since October, 2015, all external practical examinations including Comprehensive viva-voce and dissertation thesis evaluation need to be conducted at intuitional level.
- Centralized time-table was prepared with well define theory and modular practical schedule. This time table is made online on institutional website.
- To regularize and to monitor student attendance, online attendance monitoring system is followed even in this year. Attendance of practical is also made online besides student profile, attendance, result, counselor details.

- From this year, Institutional examination results are made online and that will be accessed by both students and their parents from places other than institute.
- Online teaching plan is prepared and syllabus is linked with physical and digital library resources.
- This year, with financial assistance from GSBTM, Ghandhinagar, ARIBAS has organized five days crash course on CSIR NET twice where in 80 students were trained in toto.
- ARIBAS also organized INSPIRE internship camp to bring awareness among science students for various government schemes to shape up their carrier. Institute was financially supported by DST New Delhi and total 182 students were benefited.
- To promote and evaluate research proposals for extra mural funding, committee has been formed centrally by the management of the institute and named CORE. Three of our faculty members are members of this central committee and it has started functioning. Many projects have been evaluated and recommended for submission centrally among sister institutes.
- E-resources have centralized laboratory protocols and are updated as per current semesters.
- To strengthen the physical library contents 58 books were purchased this year. The current physical library content is Books: 5275, Journals: 16, Magazine: 07, Dissertation Thesis: 1281, CDs: 231.
- D-space content was timely enriched and updated.
- A new video lecture library covering all delivered lectures during crash course on CSIR NET is created.

- The evaluation of dissertation, undertaken by final semester students, is done in three stages i.e. Project proposal evaluation by examiners in open seminar, mid-term evaluation in the form of poster presentation and final thesis evaluation and presentation. Panel of evaluators is same at all the three stages to monitor progression. Research methodology workshops are regularly conducted for the final year students.
- At Institutional level, Departmental Research Committee is framed to monitor and regulate research associated work, involved in the conduction of PhD coursework and to monitor progress of doctoral research six monthly.
- In order to promote research CVM has created Consortium of Research Enhancement (CORE). The aim of the CORE is to promote research, encourage interdisciplinary approach and inter-institute research, to guide and screen projects, check plagiarism. Three representative members of ARIBAS are part of CORE. During current year seven research proposals were screened before CORE and they were approved by the CORE subcommittee i.e. Biosciences.

5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

The institute embodies the passion for research and quality education, at undergraduate, post graduate and doctorate level in the field of applied sciences. It adopts a comprehensive approach to create resourceful and conductive environment for students to acquire discerning skills pertinent for the pursuit of knowledge integrity and freedom.

Mission: Established in 21st century, ARIBAS infuse the strengths of the experimental learning with research centred spirit, its principal aim is to earn peer and public appreciation and fulfil the academic, economic and professional expectation of state national and international communities.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

Yes, Institute has very transparent management system.

Management is headed by Chairman, with support of secretaries and joint secretaries. Management holds meetings with director and staff members to evaluate policy matters and implementation of plans.

Head of institute holds regular meetings with Head's of the Departments, faculties, Technical staff, administrative staff, and research scholars to discuss and form new strategies for various institutional program.

Faculty: The institute adopts the policy of monthly meeting with HODS and teaching staff for the proper coordination of institutional policies matters, difficulties faced by faculty in academic, research and other ventures.

6.3. Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

A new course, M.Sc. in Forensic Sciences has been approved by Sardar Patel University, Vallabh Vidyanagar. Our Institute is going to start this course from June, 2016.

BOS of Biosciences, Sardar Patel University has made Core Committee for revision of higher semester syllabus. Institute Head is appointed as one of the member of the syllabus framing committee.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

To improve the academic standard various measures were adopted by the Institute in current year.

- Restructuring of the seminar presentation and dissertation work presentation.
- For all the students seminar is compulsory and it was made mandatory to present seminars on good quality research paper downloaded from Pub med central.
- Management has purchased Plagiarism software and Checking of thesis for plagiarism is made compulsory.
- To create awareness about carrier opportunities and scholarship provided by government in basic sciences, a DST sponsored Inspire camp was organized for 12th students. 180 students from five different district of Gujarat states attended the workshop.
- GSBTM, Gandhinagar has entrusted our Institute as one of the centre for PG BT-CBC (Biotech capacity building cell). Under its auspices, we have successfully organized 02 crash courses of 5 days each in last one year for CSIR-NET preparation. Total 80 students were participated from all over the Gujarat state.
- For undergraduate Students, institute has organized workshop on molecular biology, bioinformatics, bioinstrumentation and general analytical techniques used in industry

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Seminar presentation is a part of all courses curriculum, to develop research aptitude among the students; Paper presentation has been implemented at all level of M.Sc. and Integrated M.Sc. courses.
- The evaluation of dissertation, undertaken by final semester students, is done in three stages i.e. Project proposal evaluation by examiners in open seminar, mid-term evaluation in the form of poster presentation and final thesis evaluation and presentation. - In order to promote research CVM has created Consortium of Research Enhancement (CORE). The aim of the CORE is to promote research, encourage interdisciplinary and inter-institute research, to guide and screen projects, check plagiarism. ARIBAS is a part of CORE and has three representative members. During the year seven research projects were been presented in CORE and they were approved by the CORE subcommittee i.e. Biosciences.

6.3.5 Library and physical infrastructure/instruments

Presently ARIBAS library has 5275 books. This year Library purchased 58 new books, particularly for NET/ GATE competitive examination preparation and fund was provided by GSBTM.

For the development of Research Aptitude in the students at an early age, restructuring of the seminar presentation and dissertation has been done. For all the students, starting from semester I, seminar presentation made compulsory on good quality research paper downloaded from Pubmed Central. The power point seminar is in front of whole of the class and evaluated by at least three teachers. The evaluation of dissertation, undertaken by final semester students, is done in three stages:

- i. Project proposal evaluation by examiners in open seminar
- ii. Mid- term evaluation in the form of poster presentation
- iii. Final thesis evaluation and presentation

Checking the thesis for Plagiarism has been made mandatory for all. The student's Internal results made online, so that students and their parents can assess the same from website.

7.2 Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year

As per the IQAC meetings, different strategies and action plan were decided and according to them following steps were initiated by the institute: Student's strength is one of the biggest challeng faced by many private institutes. Therefore, institute around the year do different activities for the improvement of the admission. Every year the admission counseling process within the state is initiated by the management as well as at the institutional level well in advance before the new academic session begins. This time institute has decided to focus more on local area especially Anand, Kheda, Ahmedabad and Baroda districts. During Education Fair team of faculty members including head of the institute visit different places of Gujarat state, interact with students and parents and provide them proper guidance for different opportunities in science field. Over at institutional level, 810 school students and 210 college students were counseled. 8. Plans of institution for next year


Strive for a continuous improvement is always a path of success. Followings are certain plans for the upcoming academic year.

As the proposal is submitted to Ministry of Industries & Mines Department of Govt. of Gujarat under "Scheme for Enhancement of Technical Competence and Manpower" of Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (CED). If get approval for the same then institute will act as anchor institute and try to extend the service to the society to provide skillful personalities.
- 7. Emphasize will be given to the research work and for the same faculties will be promoted to submit more number of proposals to different funding agencies.
- 8. Institute will organize different workshop/awareness programmes/orientation programmes for school and colleges students throughout the year as part of social outreach activities.

Feedback from Parents

A Parents-Teachers Meeting was organized by ARIBAS on 5th March 2016. Total 13 parents of students from M. Sc. Integrated Biotechnology Semester II to VI came personally to meet teachers; 20 parents interacted on phone. The feedback from the parents was taken on various aspects and is summarized below:

Syllabus

- Most of the parents found syllabus to be excellent or satisfactory.
- One of the parents of M. Sc. IGBT Semester II student found syllabi of Biostatistics and Physics to be bit tough.

Extra-curricular Activity

• Parents were satisfied with the extracurricular activities organized by various clubs and forums of ARIBAS.

Teaching

- In general parents were satisfied with the teaching quality of ARIBAS, some of them found it to be very good.
- Parents have discussed Internal Examination performance of their wards with concern teachers.

Administration

- By and large parents found administration to be efficient and cooperative.
- Parents were also satisfied with the on-line monitoring system of the Internal Examination on ARIBAS website. However, they suggest same facility for their wards attendance. This facility will be also being available to them in short time but in existence this facility has been made available to all the faculty members.

Remedial action taken

- ARIBAS is concerned about personality development of all its students. To produce confident and well groomed students the following activities are already in place and many students have benefited from it.
 - (i) **Personality Development Program**: This is conducted by professional bodies with emphasis on English speaking, public speaking and preparation of CV and interview etc. to name a few.
 - (ii) **Seminar Presentation (Paper Presentation):** In each semester seminar presentation is part of the curriculum, For all the students of all M.Sc courses, starting from Semester I, seminar presentation is compulsory from good quality research paper downloaded from Pub med Central; the power point seminar is in front of whole of the class and evaluated by at least three faculty members.

Other Comments

- Parents were satisfied and happy with the job of the counselor in terms of the timely information reached to the wards attendance and performance.
- One of the parents wanted support from teachers to build confidence in her ward. Due to
 which she was not able to clear first semester two papers. The student was counseled
 personally by counselor and Head of the Department. With the help of teachers she could
 clear all the papers and parent was very satisfied with the kind of support she got from
 teachers.
- In case one of the case, where the parents want their ward to change friend circle as he was showing poor performance in studies and was involved in mischief, the student was counseled by the counselor and Head of the Department and is being watched for his activities / behavior. Subject teachers have been asked to give extra attention to the student. Also the other students of the group were counseled regarding the same.

Despite informing the parents about Parent-Teachers Meeting in advance either on phone or by sending letter, not much enthusiasm was shown by the parents. They prefer to discuss the progress of their ward on phone and apathy shown by parents may be due to

- Their busy schedule
- Personal or social engagement
- Distant location in case of outside students

Feed Back from Alumni

Alumni meet was organized by ARIBAS on 27th Feb 2016. During Alumni meet, panel discussion was organized with alumni from different fields viz Academic (Teaching or Research), Industry, Entrepreneur, wherein present students discussed their queries with the alumni.

Exhibition of paintings of one of the Alumnus Tirthrajsinh Jhala of M. Sc. Biotechnology was organized in the afternoon session. He is currently placed in Mumbai and working as product excecutive in Dupen lab. Pvt. Ltd. Dr. Kanubhai Patel renowned artist & Principal of CVM college of Fine Arts was remained present as chief guest for the same.

Feedback from the alumni was taken on different aspects and is summarized below.

Curricular aspects

- Final year students should be enriched with the wide variety of options available after their studies.
- Start little more practical based courses. This would help in linking theory to practicality.
- Syllabus should be improved and unnecessary subjects should be removed. Merit should be given less importance while selecting the dissertation guide. Dissertation should also be allowed outside the college.
- Theoretical knowledge along with related scientific updates going in market should be imparted.

Co-curricular aspects

- Industrial visit should be organized for the students to understand the requirement of the different industries and they can be aware of the instrumentation facility utilize by them.
- Also try to train the students on different instruments like HPLC, GC in laboratory so that it will benefit them in getting job outside.

Extra-curricular aspect

- Encourage soft-spoken skills development programme.
- Introduce mock-interview for final semester students

Administrative aspects

• Alumi were satisfied with more effective and systematic approach of the administration.

Feedback from Students

The feedback from the students was taken on broadly three aspects; each was then further divided into subheadings:

(I) **EXPLICIT CURRICULUM:** (10 subheadings)

How well does the teacher teach the core subject?

- (II) **IMPLICIT CURRICULUM:** (05 subheadings) How well does the teacher model the core values?
- (III) **SUBJECT/COURSE EVALUATION** (03 subheadings).

The evaluation was done on a five point scale which was spelled out as 1 = Poor 2 = Average 3 = Good 4 = Very Good 5 = Excellent

All the students of ARIBAS participated in this activity and an analysis of their compiled feedback is presented below:

• The teachers were evaluated for both Explicit and Implicit Curriculum and in general, all the teachers were graded between good and very good category.

The student's feedback on Subject/Course was sought in terms of

- (i) Depth of the course content and Extent of coverage
- (ii) Clarity and relevance of the reading material provided
- (iii) Relevance of the course content in life and applicability in profession.

The students had mixed reactions regarding course content and extent of coverage. Some students found it satisfactory while others feel that more depth is required.

Remedial action taken:

1. Discussion in the faculty meeting on how to improve teaching and meet student's expectations.
